### How dramaturgical identity work shapes situated practical rationalities





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### **Identity work**

- Explaining organizational and social life in terms of 'the meanings that individuals attach reflexively to themselves' (Brown, 2015, p. 21)
- Constructing and maintaining consistent self-narratives reflexively (e.g., Giddens, 1991)
- Drawing on discursive resources (e.g., Watson, 2008)



# Identity work – a situated perspective?

#### How is identity work implicated in *everyday* processes of organizing involving...

...situated action and decision-making

(that call for situation-specific creative navigation rather than generic action-scripts)

...cross-pressures of conflicting discursive elements

(involving different epistemic and normative framings of situations)

#### ...how does identity work shape situated practical rationalities?



#### Case

Private mid-sized company producing public healthcare services

- Home care, personal assistance, family services
- Participants (n=20): frontline and middle managers
  - Mostly practical nursing background (some registered nurses)
  - Work: complex coordination involving various stakeholders and interests
    - Business interests
    - Public service/municipal administration
    - Medicine
    - Precarious labor
    - Clients' lay interpretations



#### **Context and Method**

#### Ethnography

- 16 months, 300 hours
- Covid

Initially interested in coping with contradictory normative influences. Responsibility and identity work 'emerged' through abductive analysis

Process perspective




#### **Two contributions**

- Enacting a 'responsible selves' as a generic concern of identity work that defines identities in terms of particular events and situated agency
- 'Staging' as a form of identity work









### **Responsibility and identity?**

Causal Authorship component

Also Giddens (1999)

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 'X caused a car accident (event), because X was drunk-driving (subjective attribution)'

- Normative component
  - One *ought not* cause car accidents
  - Medical doctors *ought to* cure illnesses

'the subject's identity derives from the objects and events deemed to have been authored by her' (Dan-Cohen, 1992, p. 963).

#### **Findings**



## Responsible self was a key concern of participants

'someone must take responsibility in [this company] and put one's head on the guillotine'-Elise

'then we are doing it that way and I'll take the responsibility! I'll probably lose my head!' -Victoria



# How to establish and maintain a responsible self?

- Act responsibly? Yes, but..
  - often limited causal authorship compared to expectations
- Work on identity narratives? Yes, but..
  - outcomes attributed as one's responsibilities are evaluated based on particular events rather than narrative processes as such




# How to establish and maintain a responsible self

- Dramaturgical approach? (Goffman, 1956)
  - Managing impressions? Yes, but..
    - reality bites back


Staging responsible selves


situated manipulation of the immediate relational (involving social and material relations) environment to facilitate the possibilities of presenting a desired identity.





#### **Defending reasonable attributions**








### Leveraging jurisdictions for agency and control

(Perceptions of) expectations of responsibility by significant others and oneself (both generic and particular) capabilities to enact responsible agency in terms of authoring particular events

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#### Conclusions

- Situated meanings of responsibility connect events and agency to professional and managerial identities
- Tactics of staging responsible selves have performative effects on situated practical rationalities of actors, as particular discursive resources might be useful for facilitating 'responsible selves' in various everyday situations and thus becoming vested interests to actors
